Dharma means the Real Teachings or Reality Teachings.

Moreover, the word "dharma" literally means "togetherness" or "duty that holds together," and has many other meanings, such as, truth or true nature, order, law, governance, edict, principle, ethical value, spirit, divinity, revelation, realization, and more, suggestive of spirituality that uplift human consciousness.

The name *India* (from *Indra*) means the Land of Conquerors, symbolized by that final battle of *Kurukshetra* or Armageddon, the ultimate conquest or vanquishment of the selfish and arrogant ego, the decisive victory fought and won within, the triumph of spirituality over personality.
