Not for the faint-hearted. If people get confused, blame it on Bible bloopers. Yet this is not to make fun of the Christian Bible, but to have fun learning to think for ourselves. Instead of merely believing what we are told to believe. To accept a quotation blindly is blind faith. It is reason, not false reasoning, that is the measure of enlightened faith.  - Yes: "There is a time to weep and a time to laugh" (Eccles. 3:4). No: "Sorrow is better than laughter" (Eccles. 7:3). Yes: "I commend mirth, because a man has no better thing under the sun, than to eat, drink, and be merry" (Eccles. 8:15).
- 4. What is our moral duty relative to trimming the hair on our heads? "There shall no razor come upon his head ... let the locks of his head grow" (Num. 6:5).
 - "If a man have long hair, it is a shame unto him" (1 Cor. 11:14).
- 5. Is there any remedy for a fool?
 - Yes: "The rod of correction will drive it far from him" (Prov. 22:15). No: "Though you bray a fool in a mortar, yet will his foolishness not depart from him" (Prov. 26:6).

 - No: "His days shall be a hundred and twenty years" (Gen. 6:3)
- 8. Is it desirable to be tempted?
 - Yes: "Count it all joy when in diverse temptations" (Jas. 1:2).
 - No: "Watch and pray, that you enter not into temptation" (Matt.26:41).

Yes: "He knows the hearts of all men (Acts 1:24).

No: The Lord had "to prove" the Israelites, and also Abraham, "to

know what was in their hearts" (Deut. 8; Gen. 22).

16. Is God omnipotent?

Yes: "With God all things are possible (Matt. 19:26).

No: "He could not drive out the inhabitants of the valley, because they had chariots of iron" (Judg. 1:19).

17. Is God unchangeable?

Yes: "For I am the Lord, I change not" (Mal. 3:6).

No: "God repented of the evil, that he said that he would do unto them (the Ninevites)" (Jon. 3:10).

18. Is God a merciful being?

Yes: "The Lord is very pitiful, and full of mercy" (Jas. 5:11).

No: "I will not pity nor spare, nor have mercy, but destroy" (Jer.13:14).

both man and woman, infant and suckling" (1 Sam. 15:3).

No: "I have taken away my peace, even loving-kindness and mercies" (Jer. 16:5).

Yes: "Yea, our God is merciful" (Ps. 116:5).

19. Does God ever hate?

No: "God is love" (1 John 4:16).

Yes: "He abhorred his own inheritance" (Ps. 106:40).

20. Is God's anger perpetual?

No: "His anger endures but a moment" (Ps. 30:5).

Yes: "Mine anger, which shall burn for ever" (Jer. 17:4).

21. Is God the author of evil?

Yes: "I make peace, and create evil" (Isa. 45:7). Behold, I frame evil against you" (Jer. 18:11). "I will bring evil upon them" (Jer. 23:12). No: "Out of his mouth proceeds not evil" (Lam. 3:38).

22. Is God in favor of war?

No: "I am for peace" (Ps.120:7).

Yes: "The Lord is a man of war" (Exod. 15:3).

No: "God is not the author of confusion, but of peace" (1 Cor. 14:33).

23. Is the spirit of God for peace?

No: "The spirit came upon him, and he slew thirty men" (Judg. 14:19).

Yes: "The fruit of the spirit is love, joy, peace" (Gal. 5:22).

No: "The spirit of the Lord came mightily upon him,... and he slew a thousand men therewith" (Judg. 15:14-15).

24. Has any man seen God?

Yes: "Moses, Aaron, Nadab, and Abihu, and the seventy elders of Israel" saw the God of Israel (Exod. 24:9).

No: "No man has seen God at any time (John 1:18).

Yes: "I have seen God face to face, and my life is preserved" (Gen. 32:30).

No: "There shall no man see me, and live" (Exod. 33:20).

Yes: "I saw also the Lord sitting upon a throne" (Isa. 6:1).

No: "You have never seen his shape" (John 5:37).
