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
Triosophic Tenets: From Esoteric to Resoteric

A paradigm is a pattern or model of reality from a trend of multiple viewpoints. A *Triadigm* converges the many viewpoints into a triad of unity. The realization of this triadic unity is further expressed as *Triosophic Tenets*, a trinity of wisdom principles. Triosophic tenets are esoteric or are principles with hidden meanings.

The esoteric also refers to spiritual or inner truths discovered within. When the perception of spiritual truth is fully realized, the esoteric becomes the Resoteric.
