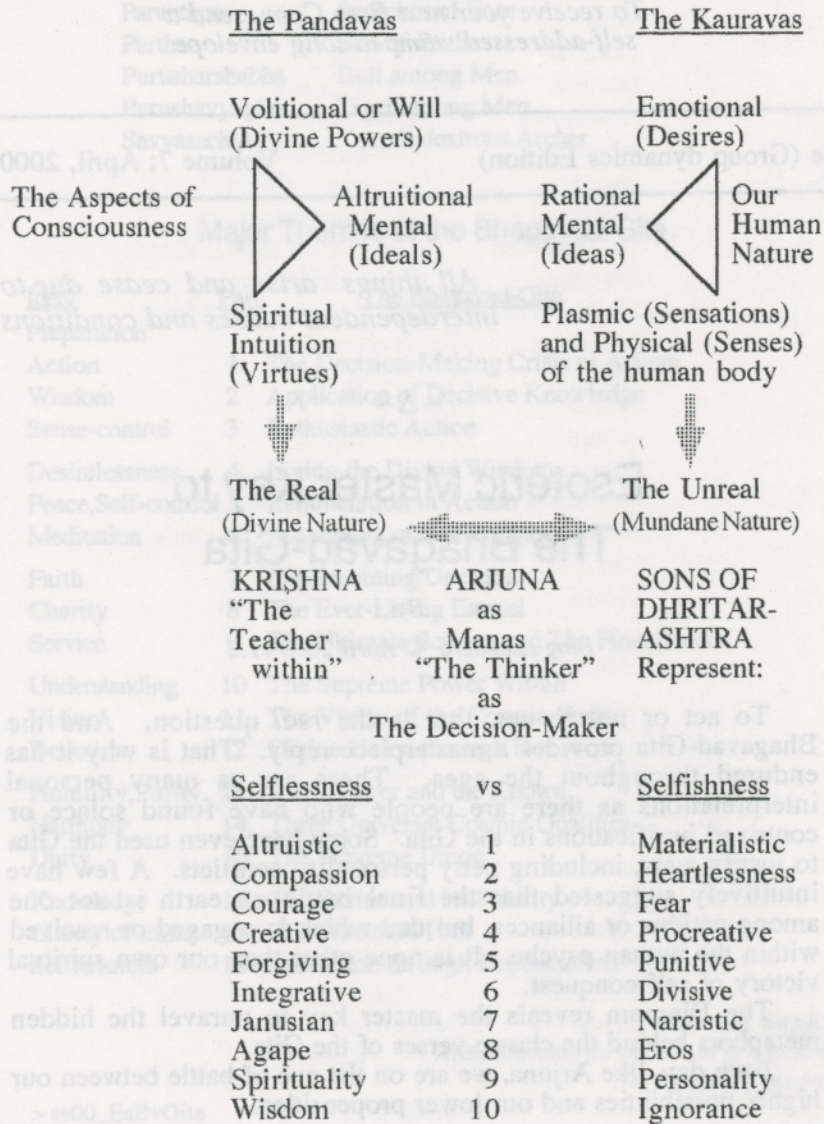
The Diagram reveals the master key to unravel the hidden metaphors behind the classic verses of the Gita.
